**POOL SECTION** 








#### SNOOKER SECTION

The SI RSA pairs title was defended successfully by our local pairing of Kevin Wright and Craig (aka Splash) Bradbury. Well done chaps!!





# The Second Southland Hunting Skills Course Fishing Charter

After weeks of rain and dismal weather in Southland, Saturday the 19<sup>th</sup> of October dawned with warmth and calmness for the SSAANZ Southland Fishing Charter, onboard the MV Kora of Foveaux Charters, skippered by Chris Donald. We arrived at Bluff and the buzz was obvious, everyone was remarking on the weather and day ahead.

There wasn't much time before the boat pulled up to the wharf. We loaded up, got the safety brief from Chris, then we were off, heading to the Northwest tip of Stewart Island and the Rugged Islands.

The "D" was made to have a dive first, while the tide was low and there was a bit of calm on the water. A few of us jumped in and started searching, but nature had other plans and the surge was massive. There were heaps of Kina, but no Paua seen, not that they had been stripped, but they had obviously moved locations. The depth as was about 20m but with a surge you were suspended in about 30m. After an extensive search and fights with the current, we moved back to the boat.

Those of us who did swim were relieved to be on the boat, as we had a common thought: We felt pretty safe when we could see the rocks below us but as we got closer to the boat the shelf dropped away to the deep blue abyss and the thought of Great White's immediately came to mind. With the internal propulsion system engaged and the squid ink on standby, it was good to be on the boat.

A quick tally up of the catch was 12 Kina and 2 Paua sniped by Geordie and then we moved to our next location for a fish. By now there was slight Easterly to South Easterly wind picking up and the currents were strong, although the surface remained reasonably calm. We were hitting the cod in what seemed to be bands then we were off, we would motor back to the start and drift again.



It was not long before Boyd landed the first fish for the team.

Also joining us were a couple of massive Mollymawks, who were watching the lines as eagerly as we were to snatch a free feed.





Luckily, the onboard Jack Russell's were there to keep them at bay.

Brydee managed to haul in a double hook up of two good sized cod and also managed to get the bragging rights over her sisters at home, that she not only caught the most fish out them but the biggest as well.





And the biggest fish of the day, well there was no denying who got that, Geordie again coming to the table with an absolute beast of a fish, a very deep and healthy cod that must have dominated the bottom for some time, at the low end, it would have been at least a 7kg fish.



A good variety of speakers and entertainment was had over the year and was well received by everyone.


We would like to see more people coming to our events to ensure we keep the Tin Hat going (the last one left in the country) and we need some fresh faces on our committee.
